Pyridoxine hydrochloride (Vitamin B6)	Vitamin, Nutritive agent	Nutrition and promotes metabolism of ethylene glycol and prevents formation of oxalic acid	Not stated			Decrease folic acid, paresthesia, somnolence	1. Monitor neuro status 2. Record diet history 3. Assess and monitor lab test 4. Report numbness

Report fast or pounding heart beat 2. Assess and teach to report rash or any reaction to medication 3. Report increased SOB 4. Monitor and report if dysphagia occurs
Lorazepam (Ativan)	Benzodiazepine	To avoid anxiety	Not stated			Asthenia, dizziness, depression, delirium	1. Caution when getting out of bed due to dizziness 2. Report and monitor for drowsiness and depression 3. Assess blood pressure
