



Medical Case 1: Kenneth Bronson

Guided Reflection Questions

1. How did the scenario make you feel?
 - a. The scenario made me feel a little scared at first because he had an allergic reaction, but I was able to call the provider and he put new orders in.
2. What signs and symptoms led you to the conclusion that Kenneth Bronson was experiencing an allergic reaction?
 - a. He stated that his throat was closing, and it was harder for him to breathe.
3. Discuss the differences between mild, moderate, and severe anaphylactic reactions.
 - a. Mild and moderate can be seen when the patient has a rash or like a tingling feeling. A severe reaction would be more swelling of the tongue and difficulty talking.
4. Discuss the importance of follow-up assessment's post-reaction.
 - a. To make sure he does not have any long-lasting effects like prolonged coughing or difficulty breathing.
5. What further needs does Kenneth Bronson have at the end of the scenario that future nursing care should address?
 - a. His allergic reaction to ceftriaxone.
6. Reflect on how you would communicate with family members in an emergency if they were present at the bedside.
 - a. I would say it appears that the patient is having an allergic reaction and that we are going to start measures to get it under control.
7. After completing the simulation and reflecting on your experience, what would you do differently (or the same) for the patient experiencing acute respiratory distress?
 - a. I would continue to sit the patient upright and auscultate lung sounds. I would also continue to monitor the patient after interventions to see if they have improved.
8. How could you prepare for clinical in order to plan for potential patient emergencies?
 - a. Reading more on how allergic reactions may look, how breath sounds may sound, and different things to be watchful for.
