Comments:

When I was finished I didn't check to see if my patient had on non-slip socks. In the future I will remember to do that.

When I hung my IVPB, I forgot to lower my primary. It will not administer the medication the correct way. Next time I when I hang my IVPB, I will be sure to hang my primary lower than my IVPB.

I forgot to ask at the beginning what my patient's pain level was. I will be sure to ask it at the beginning next time.

When I put on my gloves to clean my med. tray, My glove tore at the top above my wrist and I left it on. If that happens in the future I will get a new glove.

I did my GU assessment correct, I just misspoke and said I was palpating the stomach, I should have said palpating the bladder.

After doing my GU assessment I should have changed my gloves before cleaning my table. I will practice better hand hygiene in the future.

I should have changed my gloves before touching anything else after cleaning my patient with the cleansing wipes that came in catheter kit. I have to practice better aseptic technique in future sterile procedures.

When putting on my sterile gloves I picked up my right glove with my right hand. I should have picked my right glove up with my left hand. Then I should also do my hikers thumb when putting on my left glove. (I did correct myself in the video)

I shook the top drape when trying to get it open. I should not have done that because it increases the chance of breaking sterility.

My first betadine swap I reached across my sterile field to throw it away. I should have brought my arm towards me and then threw it away. (I corrected myself in the video)

I started the actual procedure before I moved my kit to the bed. I should have moved my sterile kit to the bed before starting the procedure. (I corrected myself in the video)

When I did move my kit to the bed, my saline syringe fell onto the bed, but I believe it was okay because I had what I needed to be sterile (catheter) in my hand ready to insert. The catheter was the main thing that needed to remain sterile. I also didn't touch the saline syringe until after my catheter was in place.

Lastly, I forgot to clean the betadine off my patient when I finished the procedure. Next time, I would be sure to clean that off.
