

## IM 2 Simulated Patient Clinical Video Grading Rubric

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There are three (3) ways to receive credit for the video:

1. Perform the scenario with all critical elements in each area of the grading tool
2. Verbalize a breach or mistake in real time and provide the nursing intervention to correct the breach or mistake then proceed with the video
3. When reviewing the video, honestly evaluate the nurse. Recognize all (if any) breaches or mistakes, record them as “unmet” and provide a nursing intervention to correct the breach or mistake

**Comments:**

1. I recognize that I should have put up my hair properly or took off my jacket so it won't fall or contaminate my sterile field.
2. For the assessment I recognize that I did assess for Skin breakdown and verbalize anything if there's any abnormal changes of the skin but failed to verbalize if there's any discharges which the patient did not have.
3. Prior the procedure or after the teaching I failed to sanitize my hands before putting the gloves which I verbalized in the video.
4. I forgot that we don't have to use the towelettes on the manikin (Sorry), but in real life scenario I would use

it.

5. After cleaning the patient, I recognize I did not sanitize or verbalize that I did prior putting gloves on which could potentially contaminate my sterile field.
6. I recognize while dropping the drapes, my sterile gloves is too close to the patient's skin or might've touched it instead of just dropping it and failed to maintain asepsis. I should have re-glove my sterile glove again.
7. I recognize that I contaminated my sterile field by crossing over, turning my back and or touching the outside portion of the field and will need to restart the procedure again.
8. I recognize while cleaning the patient's labia I was not holding it properly as it closed and contaminated the meatus which could introduce bacteria to the patient because I proceeded to insert the catheter without redoing it and failed my asepsis and should have restarted the procedure.
9. I recognize that my catheter is contaminated. As I was trying to get it from the tray, I could not get the tip steady and it started to swing back and forth which I could have held it closer to the tip and gather the rest in my hand. I failed my asepsis and should have restarted the procedure or get a new equipment.
10. In the video I failed to verbalize to insert the catheter until urine is seen then advance 2-3more inches before inflating the balloon which I should have verbalize to prevent inflating the balloon in the patient's ureter and cause patient discomfort but if that happens in reality, I make sure to deflate the balloon and advance until I see flash of urine and inflate the balloon making sure to tug gently and feel resistance meaning it is sitting in the bladder correctly.
11. When I inflated the balloon, I did not feel any resistance on my plunger, I accidently pulled the plunger out which caused to spray the fluid on to the patient. I checked and tugged gently which then again felt that the catheter is sitting in the bladder correctly. (When I tried to deflate the balloon after my procedure, I aspirated 9mLs)
12. I did not verbalize to sanitize and re-glove which I should have prior touching the patient.
13. After catheter insertion, I failed to palpate the bladder area after bladder has been decompressed before leaving the patient's room. Which could be a good example of evaluation of intervention for effectiveness.
14. After the procedure, I failed to document and save my assessment, procedure and medication which I should have done in the patient's room prior leaving the room.
