I made the following errors while caring for Mrs. CSON:

1. I consistently touched my face mask through out the video which is a breach of asepsis. I need to be mindful of not to touch my mask to prevent transferring microorganisms.
2. I was inconsistent with glove changing and hand hygiene in different parts of the video. The maintenance of clean hands and gloves is essential to clean asepsis technique and the number one way to prevent the spread of microorganisms.
3. I should have changed my gloves between the respiratory assessment and the medication administration to help maintain asepsis.
4. On my respiratory assessment I did not inspect the upper airway which is essential to ensuring that the patient does not have signs of hypoxia, deviated trachea which could indicate pneumothorax.
5. When I removed the Lispro from the Pyxis I did not inspect the expiration date or the integrity of the vial. It is essential to ensure your medications are not expired because they lose their potency. It is also essential that your vial is not damaged because this could compromise the medication.
6. I did not perform the respiratory assessment prior to placing the oxygen on my patient. It essential to assess

prior to placing the oxygen to ensure your interventions are appropriate. My justification for placing the oxygen on prior to the assessment was my knowledge of her COPD and her current O2 sat of 88%.

7. When I was checking the CVAD site and respiratory assessment I did not use proper body mechanics. I leaned over the patient and did not put the siderail of the bed down. It is essential that we use good body mechanics to prevent harming ourselves or our patients.
8. As I watched the video back, I saw and heard myself interrupting Mrs. CSON when she was answering me. This a breach in the universal competency of human caring and relationship. I was not impressed with my authenticity in this video. I need to calm my nerves more and not get so focused on the tasks and ensure that my kindness and compassion are part of my nursing role.
9. When I was administering medication to Mrs. CSON I forgot to bring a towel with me to ensure she did not become soiled with sterile water or medication. This is needed to prevent the patient's discomfort. I did problem solve by calling on my vocera but this was a lack of organization in my nursing role.
10. I should have cleaned my stethoscope twice and I only cleaned it when I initially used it. I should have cleaned it the second time because I placed it back around my neck. This is a breach in asepsis and would spread microorganisms to my patient.
11. When I removed the insulin syringe from the outer wrapping, I pulled it from the wrapping on the needle side instead of the bottom of the syringe. This could have compromised and contaminated the "holy grounds" of the needle.
12. I need to be cautious and aware of touching the diaphragm of my stethoscope once I have cleaned it. Touching the stethoscope once I have cleaned it could transfer microorganisms and is not best practice asepsis.
13. When I picked up the trash on the floor before exiting the room, I should have placed a glove on my hand to pick the trash and used the hand sanitizer. I touched the computer with my hands after picking up this trash as well. This will spread microorganisms and is not best practice for keeping the equipment as clean as possible.
