I always then ended up hurting my girlfriend's feelings even though she was trying to understand and help me. I am ashamed of what I am and what I did to her, attacking her emotionally and verbally.

My fears and concerns every day are failing. My fear of failing was rooted in me back when I was a child. My grandmother always says to me that we can't fail because that's going to ruin her name, my parents disagree with what she said, but that influence is strong especially

when you are in Asian culture. Now in the present, my fears grew bigger because I was in nursing school, my parents have supported me to this day, worked hard and gave me all these tools to accomplish my goals, and if I can't do it, I am a failure and I am just some bum in the streets, just as how they told me back when I was kid. Also, I feel like I am failing my girlfriend who supported me for 4 years. I feel like I am nothing to her whenever I fail an exam or a CPE, even though she said that she does not care about it and she's proud of me, I feel like I need to strive for more.

My expectations for this module, is that I am hoping to find a way to relate my mental problems and to find a way how to combat them. I am hoping to learn how to deal with patients who are having mental problems, how to take care of them, and how to roll with them to provide the highest care possible.
