What school does not prepare you for is how patients react. This specific patient spit on me, but she was confused. I just did what I had to do and got her comfortable after I was done and went to the bathroom and washed my face. In the moment I was extremely shocked, but I knew I had to get that done. Jessica got on to her and told her that was not acceptable but to be honest I would not know how to handle that. I pick up on a lot of behavior from the nurses because we don't learn that in school, we just get told but being on the floor I see how nurses handle situations and how much of an advocate you have to be for the patient because a lot of doctors put discharge orders for patients and their Cath insertion site is still bleeding or still on critical lab values for example their potassium. It is crazy how much things and situations come into perspective when being on the floor and now you are being the nurse. I do need to improve on teaching my patients on their medications but so far, all my patients know what their medications are its just a few that they do not like Enoxaparin. Being in this module has opened a new level for me and has surprised me on how much I know and how much I do not. I notice things about myself that I did not know I was capable of. Like being confident and taking this role seriously because I do want to learn and be ready to be on the floor after graduation. Jessica has really been a great mentor in helping me build this persona of myself and focused on my strength and better my weaknesses. Overall I have enjoyed everyday I am on the floor and always look forward to coming to clinicals.
