

## Pediatric Case 3: Eva Madison

### Documentation Assignments

1. Mucous membranes pink and moist, assessed skin turgor and no tenting was noted, heart sounds regular just fast, pulse rate - 180, RR- 33, temp - 99F, lung sounds are clear bilaterally, hyperactive bowel sounds, Patient is pale and skin was cold
2. Risk for insufficient fluid volume due to vomiting and diarrhea. Risk for electrolyte imbalance due to vomiting and diarrhea.
3. Ask name and date of birth - Eva Madison born 1/28/2015, addressed any known allergies, asked parents for relationship, full assessment, asked pain, asked history/ meds given/ where it hurts, started IV fluids that were ordered, reassessed
4. Patient need to focus on fluid replacement with oral rehydration as soon as possible. Once nausea has subsided the diet should be progressed and should focus on fruits, veggies, and low fat, with complex carbs. Avoid high sugar and carbonated drinks or anything with a high salt content. Contact provider if Eva starts throwing up and having diarrhea with no urinating.
