Yes	N/A	Rash, Injection site reaction, Diarrhea, Nausea, Pruritus, , AST/ALT elevated.	1. Monitor for changes in potential flare up. 2. Teach the patient to not eat red meats as this can cause flare up with gout. 3. Also teach patients to avoid alcohol and fruit juices instead of drinking milk and whole grains, fruits and vegetables. 4. Educate patients to inform staff of any tightness in chest or skin reaction after receiving medication as it causes pulmonary conditions.

Yes	N/A	Malaise, fatigue, ataxia, N/V, Constipation, Peripheral Neuropathy (long-term use), Dizziness, Bradycardia	1. Make sure to place the patient on a telemetry monitor as this medication affects rhythm changes in the beginning of treatment. 2. Monitor heart rate prior to medication admin as this medication can decrease heart rate. 3. I keep a look out for yellowing of eyes

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							and skin as it indicates liver issues with the medication. Wear protective clothing when taking this medication as it can cause serious burns. 4. Ask the patient if they have a history of lung, liver, heart, or thyroid issues as the medication can affect these organs.
DAPTOmycin	Antibiotics/ Glycopeptides/Lipopeptides	*Skin/Skin infections,* Complicated bacterial, Bacteremia	750 mg IVPB every 24 hours	Choose an item. Yes	IVPB- 0.9% Sodium Chloride. Rate 130mL/hr	Insomnia, Edema, Chest pain, Abdominal pain, HTN, Headache, Rash	1. I will make sure to test the patient's bowels if they present with diarrhea as this could worsen infections like C-Diff. 2. Educate patients to report increased muscle pain or weakness or worsening neuropathies. 3. I will make sure to verify allergies prior to administration as this medication is in the same class as vancomycin, a high allergic medication. 4. I will check for medication interactions ensuring that like HMG-CoA can cause rhabdomyolysis.

Monitor intake and output as not equal intake and excretion could indicate holding of urine. Teach the patient to take the medication the same every day to provide better absorption.

Yes	N/A	Nervousness, Palpitations, Tremors, Weight Loss, Insomnia, Headache, Muscles Spasms	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> This medication should be taken 1 hour before eating and alone for better absorption. Inform this patient that this medication will be taken for the rest of their lives. Make sure to also give the patient a full glass of water again for better absorption. Inform patients that this medication can increase the effects of anticoagulants.
Linezolid	Oxazolidinones	*Infections*, Pneumonia, Endocarditis, Tuberculosis, Pulmonary,	600 mg/IV every 12 hours	Choose an item. Yes	IVPB- 0.9% sodium chloride Rate-300 mL/Hr	N/V/D, Headache, Rash, Anemia, HTN, Thrombocytopenia	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> I will perform hourly rounding's and monitor for changes in LOC as this medication can cause confusion. Ask my patient to inform me of any new bruises, bumps, or bruises as this can

Encourage and check on patients to void every 2-4 hours as this can reduce urinary retention.
