Diphenhydramine	Antihistamines	Prophylactic for treatment plan	50mg/ml IVP Once	Yes, in therapeutic range.	Diluent with 1mL of NS	Drowsiness Anaphylaxis Seizures Arrhythmias	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Administer before treatment is started (IV IG & Rituximab). Main side effect is drowsiness so make sure to “Call Don’t Fall”. Medication can also cause dry mouth, so intake fluids as tolerated. Notify nurse immediately if urinating or painful urination becomes a problem.
Immune Globulin (Human)	Immunoglobulins	Idiopathic Thrombocytopenic Purpura	50g IV Once	Yes, in therapeutic range.	Admin @ 49ml/hr for 30mins, if tolerated raise every 30mins. - 90mL/hr - 197mL/hr - 394ml/hr until complete	Nephrotoxicity Hyperproteinemia Pseudohyponatremia Hyper viscosity	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Medication can cause HTN, so frequent vital signs are required. Medication can cause dizziness, call nurse if you’re needing to get up. Try to stay adequately hydrated through administration. Notify nurse of any sudden swelling, pain, itching, or warmth.
Medroxyprogesterone	Progestins	Bleeding Prevention	150mg/mL IM Once	Yes, in therapeutic range.		Weight Gain Fatigue Abnormal Menstruation Difficult/Painful Urination	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Injection may decrease calcium stores, so eat food high in calcium. Irregular menstruations are a regular side effect of this medication, don’t be alarmed. Store at room temperature away from moisture and heat. Notify the nurse of signs of an allergic reaction. (hives, swelling in face, lips, tongue, or throat.
