Comments:

When conducting AIDET, I did not fulfill duration or thanks, I will need to do this within all my future interactions. When conducting the 4 P's, I did not ask if the patient would like to be positioned, I will do this within all my future interactions.

During my respiratory focused assessment, I did not inspect the chest nor assessed for purse-lipped breathing or pallor, within future assessments, I will make sure to visualize these key points.

When beginning my CVAD dressing change, I did not clean my bedside table beforehand with antiseptic. I will do this before beginning my sterile procedure in future interactions. I also failed to clean my “pulse oximeter”, I will make sure to uphold this precaution when completing this assessment in the future.

When performing my medication preparation, I did not clean the top of the vial, in future interactions, I will make

sure to scrub the top of the vial before inserting the blunt needle.

Before giving the medication, I did not verify the integrity of the needle and volume, in the future, I will make sure to do this for the safety of my patient.

While completing the CVAD dressing change, I did not palpate for tenderness or visually re-inspect site for drainage, odor and condition of sutures. In the future, when conducting this assessment, I will make sure to properly ensure the information needed for infection and integrity of the site.

When cleaning the CVAD site with chlorhexidine, I did it in a circular motion. When conducting this procedure in the future I will use back and forth motions only.

I did not teach the patient during the CVAD dressing change to keep the site dry and avoid touching the site, nor to report changes to healthcare workers. When completing this procedure, I will make sure to inform my patient about keeping the site infection-free and healthy.

Within my video, I failed to document both, the CVAD dressing change and my respiratory focused assessment, in the future, I will always make sure to document, because if I didn't document, it didn't happen.

While I verbally stated to keep my CVAD dressing kit in eyesight at all times, I did not physically do that within my video, in the future, I will choose a different location to always have view of my sterile site.

When donning gloves, the first time during my CVAD dressing, one of the gloves had flipped over, to keep sterility and asepsis, in the future I will grab a new pair and start over.
