[During the months of October and November 2006, Jadesola Atomre was working as a Registered Nurse at Folsom State Prison. On October 7, 2006, a patient presented with severe back pain and had not left his cell in two days, but Atomre refused to assist him. On October 10th, 17th, and 31st of 2006, Atomre was reportedly sleeping on the job and failed to tend to her patients. Finally, on November 6, 2006, Atomre failed to provide timely treatment to a patient who presented with vomiting and blood in the stool. Jadesola Atomre was charged with gross negligence and unprofessional conduct.](#)

[Jadesola Atomre failed to provide safe and effective care to her patients by failing to execute the following universal competencies: physical and emotional safety and security, human caring, and professional role. Atomre could have avoided having her license suspended by refraining from sleeping during her shift, performing the necessary assessments on her patients, and quickly providing treatment to those who were feeling ill. There is no excuse for the way she brushed off her patients' symptoms and was unwilling to assist them.](#)
