Injection site reactions, increased blood platelets, rash, itching	1. Hypersensitivity in hyperbilirubinemic neonates. 2. Contraindicated for intravenous administration of ceftriaxone solutions containing lidocaine. 3. Risk of fatal calcium-ceftriaxone precipitant formation in lungs and kidneys of term and preterm neonates. 4. May cause live bacterial vaccines to not work well.

Neurotoxicity manifested as bilateral auditory and vestibular ototoxicity can occur in patients with preexisting renal damage. 2. Aminoglycosides are potentially nephrotoxic. 3. Use with caution in premature infants and neonates because of renal immaturity.
