Confusion, hallucinations, fast heart rate, sudden dizziness	1. Caution when taking this medication if you are allergic to famotidine or similar medicines. 2. Avoid taking other stomach acid reducers with this medication. 3. Caution when getting out of bed as this medication can make you dizzy and fall. 4. This medication can also be taken in an oral form.

You should not use ondansetron if you are also using apomorphine. 2. Caution when taking this medication with congestive heart failure. 3. Drink plenty of fluids to stay hydrated. 4. Make sure to give this medication with proper aseptic procedure.
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
