- I should not have uncapped the flush all the way when dispelling air bubbles. I would get a new saline flush if I contaminated the tip.
- I mentioned in the video that I would dispose of the empty vial of morphine in the sharp's container along with all of the syringes but it was not recorded.
- I forgot to mention that Morphine was an opioid and that I would be watching closely for respiratory depression.
