Acetaminophen (Tylenol)	Analgesics/Antipyretics	Relieves moderate pain and fever	176 mg of 160 mg/5 mL PO q 6 hours PRN for pain, fever			Nausea, stomach pain, loss of appetite, itching, rash, headache, dark urine	1. BLACK BOX WARNING: patients may be at increased risk of CV event, GI bleeding - monitor accordingly. 2. Contraindication in pts with an active peptic ulcer; hypersensitivity. 3. Administer drug with food or after meals if GI upset occurs. 4. Report sore throat, fever, rash, itching, weight gain, swelling in ankles or fingers, changes in vision, black or tarry stools.
Ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin)	NSAIDS	Reduce fever and relieve minor aches and pains	100 mg of 100 mg /5 mL PO q 6 hours PRN for pain, fever			Constipation, diarrhea, gas or bloating, dizziness, nervousness, ringing in the ears	1. Acetaminophen may be taken with or without food. 2. Routinely monitor the effectiveness by assessing pain levels and fever reduction. 3. Contraindicated with pts who have a hypersensitivity or active liver disease. 4. Report any vomiting, excessive sweating, pale skin.

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
