The first and second charge against Ms. Campione happened on or around July 23, 2009. She showed up to work with blood shot eyes, slurred speech, an abnormal gait, and could not think clearly. She was labeled as unfit to work with patients or a critical judgment situation. The second charge coincides with the first due to her abnormal behavior they requested a screening specimen. It was ruled negative due to Ms. Campione providing a prescription which would have led to the test being positive. However, the medical review officer required her not to return to duty until she could improve her fitness while under the prescription.

The third charge accord on or around May 11, 2011. Ms. Campione had documented giving medications to patients that based on pre-assessment data did not need more of the medications. She also failed to document the justification for the medication administration or changes in the patient's conditions that would have indicated giving the meds.

For the first and second charges Ms. Campione could have called in sick and stated that under this new medication that she could not work affectively or safely for her patients. This could have broken her Professional Role and Safety and Security of the patients. If I was one of Ms. Campione's patients and I saw her stumbling into my room and slurring her speech I would not want her to work on me. As for Safety and Security, she was not able to think clearly. She could be endangering her patients due to her not being able to pick up subtle changes in her patients or if something tragic happened she would not be able to act accordingly.

As for the third charge she broke Documentation, Critical Thinking, and Safety. She failed to document why she gave a medication when it wasn't needed and failed to justify her actions of why she did what she did. She did not go by the pre-assessment data and still gave the medication breaking her critical thinking and

endangering the patients. If she had documented her actions she might not have gotten in as much trouble. As well as if she had thought through her 7 rights she would have known not to give the medication.

If I was her coworker, I would have told her to go home because her being there in that state could bring more harm than good. If I would have caught the documentation errors, I would have checked the patients myself and asked her to recheck the patients as well. If she had given the medications as documented I would have told my charge nurse and stayed with the patients to make sure they were staying stable.
