Hypersensitivity 2. Can cause kidney toxicity 3. Slowly change positions, from laying down to sitting up, call don't fall. 4. Do not take with other acetaminophen containing drugs.
Ondansetron (Zofran)	5HT3 receptor antagonists	Nausea/ Vomiting	2 mg PO q 6hrs PRN	4 mg Yes		5HT3 receptor antagonist, Headache with chest pain, dizziness, faint, fast or pounding heartbeats, jaundice, blurred vision, tired feeling	1. If dizzy or drowsy, be slow to changing positions, ask for help 2. May cause constipation 3. Report any sudden chest pain or tightness 4. May feel tired and sleepy
Polyethylene glyco (Miralax)	Laxative	Constipation	8.5 g PO Daily	17g Yes		Nausea, bloating, cramping, gas, diarrhea, rectal bleeding, increased sweating	1. Dissolved in 4-8 oz of beverage 2. No more than 7 days 3. May cause upset stomach with bloating and gas 4. Drink it right away, do not save it for later use
Ceftazidime (Fortaz)	Third generation cephalosporins	Antibiotic treating bacterial infections	560 mg IV q 8 hrs	333 mg- 555 mg Yes		dark colored urine, confusion, headache numbness, tingling, burning pain,	1. Keep using medication even if symptoms improve 2. May cause involuntary muscle movement 3. Skipping doses can make infection resistant to medication 4. Report cold feeling, discoloration, or skin changes in your fingers
