

Pediatric Case 1: Jackson Weber

Documentation Assignments

1. Document your initial focused assessment of Jackson Weber.

My initial focused assessment that I did was a neurological assessment.

2. Identify and document key nursing diagnoses for Jackson Weber.

Risk for injury

3. Referring to your feedback log, document the nursing care you provided and Jackson Weber's response.

I turned the patient onto their side and gave them oxygen when they started to have a seizure and the patient stopped seizing shortly after. I also did a neuro assessment.

4. Document the teaching that you would provide for Jackson Weber and his mother before discharge.

Some teaching that I would provide would be safety during and after the seizure. I would also teach the mother about the medications. Like when the child should take them and any adverse effects that she needs to look for and how often the child needs to take the medications.

5. Document your handoff report in the situation-background-assessment-recommendation (SBAR) format to communicate what further care Jackson Weber needs.

S: I have Jackson Weber who is a 5yr old male. He has had one tonic-clonic seizure since he has been admitted that lasted about 1 min.

B: He has a history of tonic-clonic seizures, he was admitted after he had a 3 min tonic-clonic seizure at home, his vital signs are stable, he is currently on phenobarbital, he has an IV in his left arm with D5 NS + 20 mEq KCl/L at 58 mL/hr.

A: Patients vital signs are currently stable, patient is currently laying in bed sleeping. Mom is at bedside.

R: My recommendation is to have the doctor come reevaluate this patient and to either increase his medication dose or to change medications.
