Lidocaine - Prilocaine	dermatological	To prevent pain of small procedure by making the skin numb or loss of feeling in the area.	10 g topical once	Yes	NA	-pallor -pain on application site -rash -edema -itching -alterations in temp sensations	1. DO NOT apply to an open wound or non intacted skin 2. monitor liver functions 3. assess BP before administering 4. monitor for signs of toxicity (agitation, confusion, seizures)
Ketorolac	Anti-rheumatic	To treat mild pain	4.5mg IVP Q6H	Yes	IVP: normal saline, push over 1-2mins	-HA -somnolence -dyspepsia -GI pain -N/V -diarrhea -pruritus -dizziness	1. Black Box: cardiovascular and GI risks 2. monitor for signs of a GI bleed 3. assess BP and HR before administering 4. monitor renal function

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Heparin	anticoagulant	For central line care	20 units intr-catherter. PRN	Yes	NA	- thrombocytopenia -hemorrhage -hyperkalemia -hyperlipemia	1. DO NOT give to patients with uncontrolled bleeding problems 2. monitor potassium levels 3. monitor aPTT levels, plt count, and Hgb levels before administering medication 4. report any prolonged nosebleeds, or blood in stool or urine
Morphine	Analgesic (narcotic)	To treat moderate to severe pain	1.3 mg IVP PRN	Yes	IVP: normal saline, push over 5 mins	-pruritus -urinary retention -vomiting -constipation -HA -somnolence -abdominal pain -respiratory depression	1. Black Box: not recommended for single-dose IV, IM, or Sub-Q administration due to risk of overdose 2. monitor patient for the development of addiction to this medication 3. monitor for respiratory depression 4. teach patient to report constipation and difficulty breathing
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
