Ondansetron	PO/IV 4mg		Nausea/Vomiting	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. May cause drowsiness 2. Acknowledge any irreg. heart rhythms/may slow HR 3. Check electrolytes 4. May cause weakness
Metoprolol	PO 25mg-50mg tab		Hypertension	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Don't stop abruptly and do not miss a dose, can cause MI 2. Monitor BP/HR 3. May cause dizziness/fatigue 4. Can cause SOB/Bradycardia
Levofloxacin	PO/IV 750mg		Antibiotic TB BLACK BOX WARNING	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Can cause tendon rupture, report tendon pain in the legs 2. May cause N/V/D 3. Phototoxicity/Hypersensitivity 4. take with water @ same time qd
Vancomycin	PO/IV 125mg-250mg		Antibiotic CDIFF, MRSA, STAPH BLACK BOX WARNING	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Can cause hearing loss/ringing in the ears 2. monitor electrolytes 3. May cause nausea/vomiting 4. hypotension (rapid IV use)
Prednisone	PO 1mg - 50mg tab		Corticosteroid	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Monitor HR / can cause HTN 2. Report excessive weight gain/edema 3. Can cause N/V 4. Can cause vertigo/HA/dizziness
