Metoprolol	25mg PO 50 mg PO 100mg PO 200mg PO		Beta-blockers, hypertension	Do not stop taking abruptly, can cause MI, angina exacerbation Avoid taking if heart rate is slow
Levofloxacin	750mg/PO-IV Q24h x 7		Antibiotic: bacterial infections, TB	Can cause achilleas tendon rupture. Avoid long exposure to sunlight. make sure to drink plenty of fluids if taking a liquid med take on empty stomach. Take at same time each day Black Box Warning
Vancomycin	125 mg PO 250mg PO		Antibiotic: infections for MRSA, CDIFF, staphylococcal	Can cause hearing loss. Do not take with grapefruit juice. Take on an empty stomach. Block box warning
Prednisone	1mg - 50mg PO		Corticosteroids: decrease inflammation, COPD	Take with food/ weight gain Do not crush, chew or break can mess with delay cycle. Check BP frequently Do not stop taking suddenly Can cause Hypertension
