Collaborative Learning Guidelines


WHAT HAPPENS IF I'M LATE OR MISS AN EXAM?

ONLINE LIBRARY RESOURCES

1301 SECOND 13 WEEKS

- Can do clinical any day of the week except for class days.
- Will do four 12-hour shifts in each specialty
 - Mental health, ICU, OB, & Pedi

CLINICAL ATTIRE

- CSON Scrubs - wear for clinical & sim experiences
- Undershirt can be black, white, navy, or gray but cannot be seen below the hem of scrub top.
- Seal blue jackets only, no other colors
- Neat, clean, wrinkle free, & odor free
- Close-toed shoes & socks
- Crocks can be worn if they are white or match the color of scrubs
- NO visible jewelry on nose, tongue, or lips
- No ear bars and ear gauges are required to be filled

CLINICAL ATTIRE

- No strong scented lotions or perfumes
- Hair pulled **back**
- Men must be clean shaven (see student HB)
- NO artificial nails of any kind, must be short & clean! Neutral nail polish may be worn (clear, light gray, tan, soft pink, etc.)
- Tattoos must be covered
- Bring all needed supplies – Must have ID badge & face mask.
- Your appearance is part of the dress code!!

PROCTORED HESI EXAM POLICY

- Recommended benchmark of 850 or above recommended for Specialty HESI Exam.
- Scores **less than** 850 is recommended to do a structured remediation
- **HESI Exit Exam - must achieve benchmark of 850 or greater.** Score less than 850 will remediate and sign up for HESI Exit Exam V2. (an additional cost will apply for retakes)
- ***A Score equal to or greater than 850 earns you a 100%. A Score less than 850 receives a conversion score grade***

MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION

- Do not give any medication or invasive procedure without direct supervision by a licensed nurse
 - **when at school, you are in the student role**
 - Could result in dismissal if guidelines not followed
