CICU Clinicals:

• Your name in yellow on the clinical schedule indicates you are participating in v-simulation from home. This is to be completed between 0700-1500 followed by the Post Clinical Custom Quiz.

Dialysis Clinicals:

• Week 7, see clinical schedule for location and address. Please arrive at 0730 and observe until 1430. Please bring a lunch. Dress code and expectations are the same as inpatient units.

Simulation Week 7:

If you are assigned simulation Week 7, please be in the classroom at 0830. This is an adaptive simulation from 0830-1230.

Masks & Face Shield

o Level 2 face mask (blue medical mask) MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES in the hospital.

o Pick up a new blue mask from the unit each clinical day.

o Wear a new mask each day you are on the unit.

o N95 mask (or equivalent) in a patient room if the patient is receiving aerosol generating procedures such as high flow nasal cannula O2, CPAP or BIPAP by facemask, and so on. Refer to the attached guidelines.

o N95 masks are one-time use only.

o Get new N95 masks from the unit you are on if you need one.

Face shields

o All Faculty & Students must wear the face shield over the N95 face mask when the assigned patient(s) are receiving an aerosol generating procedure (AGP) such as NEB treatments, intubation/extubation, etc (see page 3)

- As of 4/30/21, unvaccinated individuals or those who are not fully vaccinated must wear the face shield over the Level 2 mask or N95 mask equivalent when you are within 6 feet of any patient in clinical and at the sim center.
- Clean the face shield with hydrogen peroxide or alcohol – NO BLEACH; at the beginning & end of your shift.
- Face shields should have foam at the top.

Clinical Expectations:

- Bring a copy of "CSON Student Procedure Progression" to all rotations (found in LMS – Clinical)
- Your instructor will ask you questions related to your assigned patient such as the following:
 - o Admitting diagnosis versus current problem. Medications. Why? Abnormal lab values.
 - o Is your patient on mechanical ventilation? Why? What mode and settings? Nutrition?
 - o What lines and tubes does the patient have? Safety? I/O's from the last 3 days and or trends.
- Start your day with a positive thought, you are going to learn something great today!

Bedside CPE:

• You will conduct a CPE on one patient sometime during the 2nd or 3rd week of clinical.

• Print & bring the CPE form located in the LMS – Clinical folder.

• Review the CPE example in LMS – Clinical folder and review your NIs as needed.

• You will be expected to enter a copy of the CPE into the Epic system. Please familiarize yourself with the protocol before the CPE.

Epic Documentation:

• Documentation of medication administration and invasive procedures will be done with your nurse.

• Please log into epic monthly to maintain your access. Call the helpdesk for problems with log in.

Paperwork:

• You will chart on the paper assessment sheet provided in LMS-Clinical folder for one primary patient per day.

o Print and bring with you to each clinical day.

o A patient report sheet is available in LMS - Clinical if you would like to use it for report.

You may use the report sheet for post clinical, but the form must only include age and diagnosis and no other identifying information such as DOB, name, room number or unit. Be mindful of HIPAA. Fill out the paperwork to hand in to your clinical faculty at the end of each day.

Post Clinical Meeting and Client Needs Quiz:

- Conducted on the clinical units at the end of the day.
- Client Needs Quiz - daily on Tuesday and Wednesday
 - **DUE by 1700 on the Thursday after clinical.**

Invasive tracheal/oral/esophageal and/or nasal procedures
Tracheal intubation or extubation

Open suction catheter via tracheostomy, endotracheal tube, nasotracheal intubation
Placing or exchanging tracheostomy tubes
Any oral naso-endoscopic procedure (includes oral or nasogastric tube insertions)
Transesophageal echocardiography (TEE)
ENT surgeries
Respiratory Treatments that create aerosolization
Opening a ventilator circuit
Nebulized treatments (during and for 1 hour after)
Heated high flow nasal cannula oxygen therapy
Continuous aerosol treatment CPAP/BIPAP (noninvasive mechanical ventilation)
RT intervention for secretion therapy
CPR
Other
Autopsy
Colonoscopy
DOES NOT INCLUDE: Normal oral or nasal suctioning, Vaginal delivery, Toilet flushing,
Nasopharyngeal/oropharyngeal swab collection or nasal wash
