Piperacillin/tazobactam	3.375g IVPB q 8 hrs	3.375g/100 mL 0.9% NS @ 200 mL/hr	Antibiotic Combinations Antimicrobials	*Anaphylactic reactions S/S *Report phlebitis, pain, or inflammation at IV site *Report S/S of dyspnea or anxiety *Report S/S of hypokalemia, fluid overload or hyperglycemia
Magnesium Sulfate	2g/50 mL IVPB PRN	2g/50 mL NS @ 25 mL/hr	Nutrition Electrolytes	*S/S of depressed reflexes and drowsiness *Report S/S of hypotension depressed cardiac function

Acetaminophen	1000 mg/ 100 mL IVPB Once	1000 mg/ 100 mL @ 400 mL/hr	Analgesics Miscellaneous	* Avoid alcohol use and PO Tylenol, Max :1000mg/dose, 4000mg/ day *Report S/S respiratory distress and dyspnea *DC immediately if S/S of hypersensitivity and anaphylaxis *S/S of hepatotoxicity, vomiting, and constipation
