Meperidine	Narcotic	Treat moderate to sever pain		Y N		Lightheadedness, headache, agitation, constipation, blurred vision, dry mouth, sleepiness, sweating	1. Uncontrollable shaking of a part of body 2. Call don't FALL! 3. Report any trouble with breathing 4. Can be repeated every 3-4 hrs
Promethazine	Antihistamine and Antiemetic	Treat allergies and motion sickness		Y N		Dry mouth, drowsiness, blurred vision, N/V, restlessness, ringing in ears, hyperactivity, nightmares	1. Skin sensitive to light 2. Call don't FALL! 3. Administered at bedtime or before meals 4. Notify if having difficulty breathing or fast breathing
Calcium Gluconate	Antidotes	Mineral supplement to treat low blood calcium, high blood potassium, and magnesium toxicity	IV 500mg-2g	Y N		Warmth, tingling, or a heavy feeling, chalky taste, upset stomach, gas, or constipation	1. If taken by mouth drink with plenty of water 2. Given slowly to avoid tissue necrosis 3. Report if you have little or no urination 4. Monitor rapid weight gain

Observe for signs of adverse effects 3. Only applied to eyes 4. Cleanse infant's eyes as needed before application
Engerix B	Viral Vaccine	Help prevent Hep B		Y N		Diarrhea, mild fussiness, low fever, or runny nose	1. Hep B is a serious disease caused by virus 2. Vaccine helps prevent this disease 3. Helps your child's body develop immunity 4. Vaccine given IM, will need a booster
Hepatitis B Immune Globulin	Immune globulins	Prevent Hep B		Y N		N/V, diarrhea, agitation, upset stomach, tired feeling	1. Given to babies who are born to mothers infected by Hep B. 2. Administered as soon as baby is born or within 12hrs 3. Additional two doses given at 1mon. and 6mos 4. Given IM into muscle
