Signs & Symptoms

- Anatomical defects: Ears, hooded eyes
- Stridor
- reflux
- Mucous webbing in mouth + nose
- Murmur / Cardiac Complications

Pathophysiology

A disorder caused by chromosome 22 defect. A segment is deleted by an inherited gene. Causes malformations in embryonic development

Diagnostics/Labs

- ↓ Creatinine, Protein, bilirubin
- Abdominal XR not back yet
- Barium Swallow: No frank aspiration. Abundant reflux.

DiGeorge 22q11 deletion

Treatment/Medication

- NG tube for now, will have G-button placed Friday 4/1
- Calcium + Vitamin Supplements.
- Pepcid: Save trachea.

Nursing Implications

- watch electrolytes
- NPO - Aspiration risk
- Could be immunodeficient - Keep baby safe

- 50% chance of each baby having it
