**In January of 2018, Tyna Allen was contacted by a friend asking for her to provide them with a document that would say that she provided and read a TB skin test for their children. Upon presenting the document to her friend, they subsequently turned it into a foster care agency his children were under the care of. Upon further investigation, the agency questioned the friend about the test they claimed their children received, which they admitted was fraudulent and Mrs. Allen never saw his children or administered care of any kind.**

When contacted by her friend to fraudulently create a document saying she administer TB test to the children, she should have rejected his request and have him travel to where she is to do the test or turn him to someone who could.

Mrs. Allen violated safety and security. She violated this universal competency by falsely claiming she administered a TB test when she did not. By being untruthful, she placed her friend's children in danger by not actually checking if they had a reaction. If the children actually had Tuberculosis, there would be no way to tell and since she claimed she read it and it was false, it would be harder for a HCP to detect it due to the recent negative test. This would have made it harder for the children to get necessary treatment.
