| Acetaminophen | 650 mg tab PO Every 4 hours PRN | | Mild pain | BBW prevent dosing errors/ do not exceed limit(4000 mg a day) (may cause accidental overdose) Take with a full glass of water (may cause GI upset, hemorrhage) call before getting up/ report any bleeding (can increase anticoagulant effect) |
| Gabapentin | 200 mg capsule BID | | Neuropathy | Avoid activities requiring mental alertness (may cause dizziness) Avoid abruptly stopping med (may cause seizures) Report respiratory depression (depresses CNS) |
| Insulin lispro | Injection 0-12 units QID before meals and nightly | | High BS | Never share insulin pen (can result in HIV) Watch for symptoms of hypoglycemia (lowers BS) Know how to administer and injection site rotation (may cause bruising, and lipodystrophies) |
| Hydrocodone- | 5-325 mg | | Moderate pain | BBW- monitor for development of |
