Magnesium Sulfate	Laxatives	Prevention of seizures with preeclampsia	IV or IM	Y N		Respiratory depression, depressed deep tendon reflexes	1. Have calcium gluconate available 2. Monitor for toxicity and stop the medication 3. Oxygen and suction at bedside 4. May also be used to prevent contractions in preterm labor
Meperidine	Opioid	Severe pain	IV or PO	Y N		Respiratory depression and constipation	1. Call don't fall 2. Monitor for constipation 3. Monitor respiratory rate 4. Only take as prescribed
Promethazine	Antihistamine	Treatment of allergies and nausea and vomiting	IV or PO	Y N		Twitching, shallow breathing, jaundice and lightheaded	1. Monitor for signs of jaundice, yellowing 2. Drowsiness, do not operate heavy machinery 3. Avoid sunlight 4. Monitor for twitching or uncontrollable movements
Calcium Gluconate	Minerals and electrolyte	Antidote for Magnesium sulfate	IV	Y N		Fatal arrhythmia, flushing,	1. Cardiac monitoring 2. Push slowly 3. Have available with use of magnesium

Engerix B	Viral vaccine	Prevents hepatitis B	Injection	Y N		Diarrhea, fever, runny nose, fussiness, weakness, fatigue	1. Monitor injection site for irritation or infection 2. Monitor for diarrhea 3. Given asap from perinatal exposure 4. Monitor for allergic reaction
Hepatitis B Immune Globulin	Immune Globulins	Prevention hepatitis B with exposure to contaminated products	Injection	Y N		Fever, light-headed, loss of appetite, jaundice, nausea	1. Monitor injection site for irritation or infection 2. Chart feedings for possible decrease in appetite 3. Monitor for fever 4. Assess skin for an allergic reaction
