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What medications and nursing interventions/treatments will you anticipate?

- continuing to monitor airway & ck. patency!
- Helping w/feeding to ensure proper nutrition

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How will you know your patient is improving?

- gaining weight, pooping & peeing, responds to stimuli, sleeping well, clear lungs, vitals are stable, all labs and tests are normal & WNL

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What are risk factors for the diagnosis?

- Neurologic
- infection/sepsis
- feeding → failure to thrive

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What are the long-term complications?

- neurologic delay → due to deprived time of oxygenation
- swallowing complications → may need thickened food for a longer period of time.

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What patient teaching for management and/or prevention can the nurse do?

- How to feed baby properly
 - checking for suck, swallow, & gag during each feeding
 - color of baby
- SIBS
 - back to sleep
- S/S of infection/sepsis education
- RSV season coming → not taking baby around sick people
- vaccines!
