<u>Clindamycin in Dextrose</u>	<u>Antibiotic for omphalitic soft tissue infection</u>	<u>192 mg IV q6h</u>	<u>Yes</u>	<u>Dextrose 12mg/mL 32 mL/hr</u>	<u>morbilliform eruptions, Abdominal pain, Diarrhea, nausea</u>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Report severe diarrhea → hydrate, fluids 2. Monitor bowel frequency 3. May cause pain/swelling, monitor IV site 4. May cause itching, try to refrain 5. May cause dark urine, Not necessarily a sign of dehydration.
<u>Acetaminophen</u>	<u>Analgesic / Antipyretic for pain</u>	<u>268.8mg IV PRN q6h</u>	<u>Yes</u>	<u>160mg/5mL</u>	<u>Pruritis, Constipation, N/V, Headache, Infection, agitation, Atelectasis</u>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Do not confuse mg with mL to prevent overdose 2. Make sure pump is programmed correctly 3. Call doctor if you have pain/tenderness in upper stomach. Could indicate a liver problem. 4. Call doctor for itching, trouble breathing/swallowing - anaphylaxis
<u>Amoxicillin</u>	<u>Antibiotic for strep / Otitis media</u>	<u>1000mg IV Daily</u>	<u>Yes</u>	<u>400mg/5mL</u>	<u>Rash, Diarrhea, N/V, headache</u>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Report severe diarrhea 2. Eat meal ~ 1hr prior to taking medicine 3. Call doctor in case of skin rash: individual lesions 4. May experience N/V, headache or vision changes (myopic infection)

Difficult to start, NO IV fluids
