Stop taking right away if you have s/s of liver problems, such as: stomach pain (upper right side), loss of appetite, tiredness, dark urine, clay colored stools, or jaundice.</li><li>2. Talk to HCP about safety of use if you've had cirrhosis of the liver/if you drink alcohol daily.</li><li>3. Stop medication and contact HCP if you have skin rash, ongoing headache, N/V, redness or swelling.</li><li>4. Taking acetaminophen may cause false results with certain glucose monitors. If you have DM, ask HCP of best way to monitor blood sugar while on this medication.</li></ol>
