Charlotte also believes that Raider has his followers sneak into her room at night while she is sleeping and steal her breast milk for the infant. Anxious and fearful since admission with periods of agitation. Intermittently yells out, "No!"

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	Labs and diagnostics:	Substance use toxicology (urine) was negative
Assessment	Nurse's assessment:	Oriented to person only. Has been anxious and fearful since admission. Fearfulness escalates when Charlotte talks about her delusions. Able to follow simple directions. Ate about half of lunch after I sat with her and took bits of food off of her tray and ate them to assure her that the food was safe. Mood is anxious and affect is blunted except when talking about her delusional ideation.
Recommendation	Plan of care:	Continue to monitor closely for safety of self and others, assess presence of delusions and hallucinations, and support patient without supporting delusional content. Social worker will consult with Charlotte and her caseworker about discharge needs on Thursday.
