<b>Assessment</b>	Nurse's assessment:	Tyler is irritable and became angry during the admission assessment. He received acetaminophen 1000 mg at 1500 for level of pain 10/10. He is complaining of feeling achy and jittery with pain all over.
<b>Recommendation</b>	Plan of care:	Assess efficacy of acetaminophen in pain management, maintain safety, offer fluids and a snack, minimize external stimuli, obtain complete drug history, and encourage verbalization of feelings.
