Pantoprazole	40mg A.C. B.I.D.		Used to treat damage from GERD, or acid backflow from stomach, and heartburn. It lowers the level of acid	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Stay hydrated, may cause headache

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			in the stomach.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Report nausea, and vomiting 3. Report abdominal pain, may cause gas.
Phenazopyridine	100mg T.I.D.		relieves urinary tract pain, burning, irritation, and discomfort.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Urine will be orange in color 2. May cause headache, so stay hydrated 3. Upset stomach is to be expected, use tums for relief
Sucralfate	1g PO Q.I.D A.C.		Used to treat and prevent return of duodenal ulcers.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Drink fluids and move. May cause constipation 2. Do not eat after taking, the medication may not coat the ulcer properly. 3. Report rash or hives unexpectedly
