Disciplinary Action Summary #3

Name of Defendant: Ashley Margaret Webber

Date Action was Taken Against Defendant: 11/12/2019.

Type of Action: Revoked

Around 09/23/2016, Ashley Margaret Webber performed a laceration repair on a patient which was out of Webber's scope of practice. Webber also, around 04/24/2017, Webber left her place of employment without informing her supervisor, leading to one of Webber's injured patients leaving without receiving the care they needed. Once again, around 06/05/2017, Webber performed a laceration repair which was out of her scope of practice. Webber then again around 08/23/2017, misappropriated Toradol from the medication dispensing system after being given a verbal order to remove blood pressure medication from the on-call provider. Webber then around 11/28/2017 while applying to another position with HealthTrust Workforce Solutions, falsified the issued and renewal dates on her Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) certification. She then again 05/04/2018 falsified the issued and renewal dates on her ACLS certification. Her final charge was on 05/08/2019 her license to practice as a registered nurse in the state of Oregon was revoked by default.

If Webber just decided to perform care that was under her scope of practice, she could've avoided two of her charges. If she also informed her supervisor that she was leaving, her patient would've had proper care and wouldn't have been injured any further. By not misappropriating her medication and listening to her verbal order, she would've been able to prevent the charge of defrauding the facility and the patient's cost of medication. Also, if she just took the time to renew her certification she wouldn't have been putting her patients in harm's way if she was hired. She was trying to mislead her potential employer.

Webber violated her professional role as a nurse, documentation, human caring, critical thinking, communication, and the safety and security of the patient. By the misuse of Toradol and false documentation, Webber violated documentation. By attempting to lie to her potential employer about her certification, Webber violated the communication and safety and security of the patient. By practicing outside her scope of practice, Webber violated the safety and security of her patient, her professional role as a nurse, and her critical thinking. All her charges reflected her disregard for her patients, especially since she decided to leave without informing her supervisor and bloated the human caring universal competency.

If I saw her attempt to practice outside of her scope of practice, I would've warned her to stop what she was doing and if she refused, I would report her to my charge nurse. In addition, if I saw her leave her patients without informing the supervisor, I would check on her patients and then report her to the charge nurse. Also, if she tried to perform ACLS without the proper certification, I would warn her and then inform my supervisor. I would also inform my supervisor upon learning about her misappropriating Toradol. All of her charges put her patient in harm; 's way and I would do as much as I could to guarantee patients' safety.
