Famotidine	Histamine 2 blocker	Decreases gastric acid in stomach	20mg IV injection Q24hrs	yes	Dilute 2mg in 8mL of NS  Final concentration: 2mg/mL	blood in urine or stool tachycardia lack of appetite	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Contact your HCP if you notice red tinged urine or stool</li> <li>This medication can cause fast you to have a fast heart beat, contact HCP if this occurs</li> <li>If you notice weight loss due to not eating, contact the HCP this could be an adverse reaction to the medication.</li> </ul>

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Acetaminophen	Antipyretic and Analgesic	Used to treat mild to moderate pain and fever	650mg  PO PRN  Q6hrs	yes		diarrhea  Nausea or vomiting  swelling	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● If you start to have diarrhea while taking this medication contact your HCP, this could be a sign that you have taken too much medication.</li> <li>● This medication is usually well tolerated but if you begin to experience N/V after taking this medication, notify the HCP</li> <li>● If you notice a skin rash appear after medication let HCP know this could be an allergic reaction</li> </ul>
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
