### Patient Physical Assessment Narrative

**PHYSICAL ASSESSMENT NARRATIVE BY SYSTEMS: (Complete using assessment check list and reminders below).**

**GENERAL INFORMATION** (Time of assessment, admit diagnosis, general appearance)

0730 - Pt transferred to CMC for pyelonephritis. Pt appears tired. Pt appears clean and well-kept.

**Neurological-sensory** (LOC, sensation, strength, coordination, speech, pupil assessment)

Pt is A&O x4. Sensation intact x6. to sharp and dull & warm and cold. HGTW & pushes/pulls strong (B). Pt c slow, uncoordinated movements. Pt speech is clear and pt is ~~slow~~ slow to respond to questions. PERRLA intact and 3mm.

Comfort level: Pain rates at 8 (0-10 scale) Location: "back and joints"

**Psychological/Social** (affect, interaction with family, friends, staff)

Pt c flat affect. Interacts c staff appropriately. No family or friends at bedside at this time.

**EENT** (symmetry, drainage of eyes, ears, nose, throat, mouth, including dentition, nodes, and swallowing) EENT symmetrical c no drainage noted.

Sticky mucus membranes noted. Poor dentition. (B) Nodes are palpable. Pt swallows c ease.

**Respiratory** (chest configuration, breath sounds, rate, rhythm, depth, pattern)

Chest symmetrical. Breath sounds are clear in all lobes. Regular rhythm and a rate of 20. Pt is able to take a deep breath. Regular pattern of breathing. Pt on 1L/min via NC.

**Cardiovascular** (heart sounds, apical and radial rate, rhythm, radial and pedal pulse, pattern)

S<sub>1</sub> & S<sub>2</sub> auscultated. Apical and radial pulse of 71. Regular rhythm and pattern. Radial and pedal pulses 2+ (B).
