Mr. Graham accessed the medical dispense system in multiple units under the account of twenty-four different patients to withdraw IV Benadryl. However, after he would withdraw it from the machine, he would cancel the transactions. The staff then reported that the IV Benadryl supply was low. After further investigation Mr. Graham's nursing license was revoked for defrauding his patients and work facility.

I believe there should be rules enforced such as more paperwork done to cancel a transaction of a medication. The paperwork should state why it was pulled and why the transaction was then canceled. I think another thing that could be done differently is placing a chart in the med room showing who canceled what transactions or meds after they were pulled from the machine. This could serve as a reminder to staff that before you leave, you should empty your pockets of all meds or extra supplies. This would make it a little more difficult to steal without others noticing.

A universal competency that needed improving would be his professional role. He broke this competency by stealing from the facility and poorly managing the equipment he was supposed to use to help patients. Instead, he broke his peers, patients, and faculty's trust because he went behind their backs to take the IV Benadryl.
