

This morning, I was feeling a little nervous going into the clinic, but I felt confident. I interacted with all the patients I came across and introduced myself. Many of them congratulated me on what I'm doing and thanked me. I didn't have anyone that did not want me to draw their blood. I'm very happy to announce I did not miss any of the patients I drew blood on.

I made sure the patient was comfortable in their chair, made sure when putting the tourniquet on checking for a vein that I did not leave it on their arm while getting my supplies ready. I removed the tourniquet first while I gathered everything. I made sure to bevel up, asked the patient if they were still doing okay on the ones that had several tubes to fill. I made sure to pop the tourniquet first before pulling out the needle and immediately pushing the safety to cover the needle. Educated the patient on how long to leave the ~~coban~~ on before removing it to insure the blood has clotted. Every patient told me, "thank you".

I am always professional around patients, but this gives me a sense of respect in return. The patient is comfortable with me and trusts me and that is very important to not only me but to them as well. I will definitely use this experience in the future when learning how to do IV's in the hospital setting. I have not drawn blood in a while and it's similar to IV sticks, but I feel more confident moving forward to drawing IV sticks as a future nurse. I appreciate the experience and I thanked them for letting me be there today. The gentleman Steve, I shadowed was extremely nice and very patient.
