Meds:

1. Cefazolin 1 gram in 50 ml of NS IVPB Q8H
2. Insulin Lispro Sliding Unit SubQ 4 times/day
3. Insulin Glargine 30 units SubQ Bedtime
4. Acetaminophen 650 mg PO Q6H PRN temp >100.5F or for discomfort
5. Ondansetron 4 mg IV Push PRN for Nausea
6. 0.9% Sodium Chloride to run at 80 ml/hr
