Yes med is within therapeutic range	Diluent w/ 1ml of sterile water slow administration over 3 minutes through G-tube	dizziness, fatigue, tremors, irritability	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. behavioral changes and agitation/irritability may occur.</li> <li>2. caregiver needs to watch closely for any signs of faintness/syncope</li> <li>3. Pt should be advised to wear medical ID bracelet incase parents are present w/ child</li> <li>4. do not d/c medication abruptly and make sure to speak to HCP if wanting to d/c child off medication; gradual discontinuation is recommended</li> </ol>
phenobarbital	barbituate	Tx for status epilepticus and seizure management	32.4 mg tablet per g-tube BID	Choose an item. Choose an item. Yes this med is within therapeutic	Diluent w/ 1ml of sterile water slow administration over 5 minutes through g-tube	Irritability, loss of appetite, bone and joint pain, liver damage (rare), clammy skin	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. keep diary and time frequency of seizures to see if medication is being effective</li> <li>2. if yellowing in the eyes is noted call HCP immediately thi can be sign of liver damage/liver toxicity</li> <li>3. try to help soothe pt if hyperactivity</li> </ol>

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
