

# Events Leading to Action Taken

## Event 1

on July 25th, 2018 while employed at Covenant Health, Lubbock Tx Tori was deemed to have lacked fitness to practice. Tori was unable to walk on her own, had slurred speech, and unable to perform comprehensive nursing assessments. She was also caught being unable to keep her eyes open while on shift.

## Event 2


On July 25, 2018, Tori failed to administer medications as ordered by the physician, This resulted in non-efficacious treatment of the patient diagnosis.

## Event 3



On October 1, 2018, Tori lacked fitness to practice, she was found propping herself up on the wall, altered communication with staff, heavy glazed eyes, and took an unually long time to respond to questions, she was also found having a hard time staying awake while documenting.

## Event 4

On October 1, 2018 Tori Uribe failed to document nursing assessments for her patient. This action resulted in incomplete medical records which would result in patient harm in that later caregivers would have inaccurate information on which to base care.



# Measures to Prevent Patient Harm



Actions I feel should be taken to protect patients would be to alert the charge nurse, so that we could plan accordingly to the nurse's behavior. I feel she would also benefit from some sort of intervention for substance abuse so we could correct the behavior and possibly help patients in the long run.





# Universal competencies

Tori broke the safety and security competency when showing up under the influence as well as not administering medication. While showing up influenced by substances that also puts a decline on patient trust

She also did not meet criteria for the critical thinking competency. Since Tori was coming to work under the influence resulting in impaired judgment concerning patient symptoms and treatment

The biggest competency broken was documentation. Undocumented care is care that did not happen. Not only would that affect the hospital, but it would also affect her, the patient, and the nurse following her shift.

Tori also broke the professional role competency when showing up with glazed eyes, unclear speech, and her interactions with patients and staff.
