<p style="text-align: center;">Safety & Quality</p> <p>Describe anything you accomplished to maintain a safe, quality environment</p>	<p>To help maintain safety, I would make sure the chairs were pushed in so nobody could trip and fall on them. I also would make sure that I wouldn't ask patients questions that may trigger them and told them beforehand that if they didn't feel comfortable answering my questions, they did not have to.</p>

How can you use this to further improve your practice in the future? • What have you learned from clinical? 	<p>Sitting in on the group discussions helped me learn about myself and how I can have better coping strategies and what my boundaries are like.</p> <p>Applying the ways that the therapists interacted with the patients was good for me to see. The younger therapist tried to relate to them more as far as age and gave the patient the same type of energy back that they were giving her. In previous clinicals, I would just talk to patients more on a surface level than trying to get to know them. I felt like this clinical really allowed us to sit down with the patients and get to know them on a deeper level.</p> <p>As I said, the group sessions helped me learn about myself as well so yes, I will be using these strategies while caring for patients.</p> <p>I learned that instead of labeling someone as "crazy" or "psycho" that some of them cannot understand what they are saying and have no control over what is going on inside of them like "healthy" people do.</p>

My concerns with RM are that he really depends on finding happiness from others around him. He worries about other people and will do anything for him but when he needs something in return, nobody is there for him. I would recommend that he gets into some therapy one on one to talk about boundaries and what are healthy/unhealthy boundaries for him.</p>

About yourself?)</p>	<p>I felt like at times, I struggled with really staying serious when someone was telling me something.
