


# **Disciplinary Action Summary**

# Actions

- Deenna's actions on May 11, 2012 were failure to complete a blood transfusion documentation for a Patient. This could've resulted in injury to the patient if caregiver would've relied on her documentation .
- On June 4, 2012 , the nurse failed to correctly connect the feeding tube to a NICU baby. The feeding was not administered, it was all over the bed. Which made the patient not have the proper nutrition.

# Actions

- On December 22, 2012 , the nurse failed to ensure that the patient was secured in the crib before leaving for break. Could've caused fall injury to the patient.
- On April 2, 2013, the nurse failed to check the 3 identifier when pulling out breast milk for feedings. Could've caused the patient to develop and infection or disease from that milk.

# Preventative Actions

Documenting before and after the blood transfusion.

Assess to make sure that the tube was fully inserted into the nasogastric or the orogastric area before giving food into the tube.

Double checking patient position and railing is up before leaving.

Verifying patient's 3 identifiers with the eMAR. So that she will know the exact name.

Slowing down at each task, before going to the next task.

---


**Security**: failed to verify the patient, before giving patient the wrong breast milk.
