1. What did you observe during the day? Were there any specific procedures that were able to participate in or observe?

I was able to observe several paps smears, swabs, an IUD being taken out, an IUD being placed, and lots of patient teaching.

I witnessed lots of patient teaching. A lot of it was about how important it is to regulate hormones and how they affect the body. Also, a lot of it was about the specific options of contraceptives and what each of them do. There was medication teaching and teaching over the specific issue the patient had. The nurses did a wonderful job at explaining everything in a way the patient would understand and allowing the patient to ask any questions they may have.
