Acetaminophen	1000 mg tab		To treat pain related to UTI	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Do not exceed maximum daily dose of 4000 mg to protect liver fx 2. Do not take with alcohol 3. Encourage use for only specific parameters provided in orders
Carvedilol	6.25 mg tab		To treat hypertension	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Never abruptly stop taking the medication 2. Caution when changing position, Report dizziness or weakness 3. <i>Diabetic patient - monitor blood glucose, can mimic hypoglycemia</i>
Gentamicin	300 mg IVPB	300 mg/ 100 ml 0.9% NS	Antibiotic to treat UTI	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Entire dose needs to be taken even if they feel better, in order to prevent antibiotic resistance 2. Report signs of hypersensitivity, tinnitus, vertigo, or hearing loss 3. Report s/s of peripheral numbness or tingling in the extremities because neurotoxicity can happen

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Levetiracetam	250 mg tab		Used to treat epilepsy	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Report suicidal thoughts or behaviors. 2. Abruptly stopping medication may cause seizure activity 3. Advise patient about the risk of daytime drowsiness and decreased attention and mental focus so call before getting OOB.
