

Instructional Module 6: Obstetrics Community Clinical Experience

Community Site: Parkridge

1. What did you observe during the day? Were there any specific procedures that were able to participate in or observe?

STI testing, pregnancy tests, urine tests for infections, Information about planned pregnancy, and STI protection.

2. What was the best/most interesting part of the experience?

The most interesting part is learning how they do the STI tests and HIV tests in office. STI gets sent off to lab to obtain results but HIV/Syphilis is done in the clinic. I also think the interesting thing about this clinic is that they help the community- college students, people with no insurance, people who don't know where to turn for information and at no cost.

3. Is a community nursing position something that you would consider working in? Why or why not?

Yes! I've always enjoyed working with Non-profits and this is something I would consider. I enjoy helping others and being able to help others, especially young people that don't know where to turn.

4. Do you feel like this community site met the needs of the population they serve? Why or why not?

Yes, I feel this site meets the needs of the population. They see mostly 17-25 age group but they can actually see any age group. Services are free and available to the community. This is helpful for students and individuals that do not have health insurance or any resources about STI's or about pregnancy. They also offer counseling services and help women who are on the fence about abortion. There are also counselors, nurses, and others in the clinic that do presentations at schools, etc to share information about STIs, pregnancy, and safe sex. That is something all schools should be offering.

5. Did you witness patient teaching? What general things were taught to this population? Do you feel that patient teaching in this community site was adequate? Why or why not?

Yes, the RN educated young women about STI's depending on the reason they were there. She also educated on birth control and offered resources for future care. She thoroughly explained how the STI and HIV/Syphilis testing works. She allowed time to listen to the patient's and answered their questions, they appeared nervous and embarrassed at first but then they felt comfortable with her. The population she saw were college students and this information that she shared with them was very important. I really felt that the patient teaching was adequate because the patient demonstrated understanding.

Pregnancy test and STI testing was done and the pregnancy test was negative. She shared her history and the relationship was only casual. The nurse shared information about safe sex and birth control. Patient was engaged and understood.

Communication was excellent. The RN listened and patient began to open up about her ex's needle drug use. Nurse then explained how an HIV test would be beneficial and that it was up to the client. She understood and wanted to be safe so she agreed to the test.
