I witness a lot of patient teaching, some of the general things that were taught to this population was learning warning signs and when it's an emergency rather than just a clinic call, I think it's important for moms to know when something isn't ok, and they need to seek help. I believe the patient teaching was perfect in this clinic they taught patients from a range of - this is the different tools I'll be using during your pap smear, to advising a patient to take a baby aspirin everyday to lower her changes for preeclampsia.
